1. Meeting Opening 7:30 pm

Pledge of Allegiance – Led by Mr. Barile.

- a. Opening Comments – Mr. Taylor praised the Memorial Day Committee for the parade and ceremonies especially Gregory Keane for his Gettysburg address. Mr. Barile stated the Johnson School “Moving on Ceremony” went well. He announced the graduates and award and scholarship winners. He also thanked Mike Quigley, School Committee member moving out of town who just resigned. He was instrumental in new school management. Mr. Chelgren thanked Tony Pierantozzi and Kevin Andrews who have led the school turn around.
- b. Approve minutes of 5/4/17 and 5/18/17, ES minutes 5/18/17 and release ES minutes of 3/2/17 and 3/9/17 – Mr. Taylor made a motion to approve the minutes. Mr. Barile seconded for discussion but wished to table the approval to make changes in the minutes. Approval tabled.

2. Ongoing Business

- a. Citizens Forum – Ms. Jen McCarthy gave an update on the Fireworks Fund. Donations still needed. The Board thanked her for all her hard work.

3. Town Administrator Report

- a. Airplane Noise – Public Meeting – Mr. Robert Damcio of the Logan Airport Advisory Committee led the meeting about increased airplane noise due to pilots turning too soon over waypoints. He distributed handouts explaining waypoints. Challenge is to get pilots to turn closer to the way point and to change the way point from a fly by to fly over. Mr. Damico requested that citizens call their state and federal elected officials. Resident Mr. George Mihovan has called Massport numerous times. Ms. Pam Wilson suggested adding noise abatement telephone number at Massport to Nahant website and elective officials’ phone numbers. She also suggested asking for a copy of your complaint when calling Massport. Megan Hammel, Senator McGee’s Chief of Staff and John Ford, of Representative Crighton’s office were present and will continue to work with Massport and FAA to alleviate the problem.
- b. Vote for Approval of Sale of Bonds and Signing of Associated Paperwork Mr. Taylor made a motion that the Board of Selectmen vote to adopt and approve the votes provided by Bond Counsel and attach them as an exhibit to the minutes. Mr. Barile seconded the motion. Unanimous vote to approve. (#1 Attached to minutes)
- c. Special Town Meeting – Review Date Options – Mr. Chelgren presented two timelines. Mr. Taylor would like to wait to see Committee’s progress before setting a date but will give them 11/4 date as a target.

d. Coast Guard Housing Advisory Committee – Mr. Barile introduced the committee: Ms. Manadee, Mr. Viviano, Ms. Passanissi, Mr. Barbara, Mr. Cullinan, Ms Marden, and Mr. Caggiano, Mr. Hambleton. Mr. Taylor questioned why the appointment letters stated they were moderator appointments. The moderator sent out the letters. Mr. Chelgren will have the correct revised motion at their first meeting. Mr. Taylor stated that the committee’s charge is to make a recommendation on the use of the parcel of land. Mr. Barile stated that the decision might go to regular annual town meeting so the committee will not be rushed.

e. Trash Collection: Mr. Nocella from Waste Management introduced the two day collection which will start the week of July 17 – Thursday Little Nahant and Bass Point to Spring Rd and Friday – rest of Big Nahant. Information is posted on website. Mr. Barile reviewed the complaints – mainly broken barrels and recycle bins, broken glass and missed trash. Mr. Nocella encouraged residents to call 1-800-972-4545 with complaints. Mr. Prochorchik of Chamberlin Circle asked for recycle bins. Mr. Nocella stated you could use regular trash barrels with recycle sticker. Mr. Chelgren explained that the town had applied for a DEP grant for uniform/standard recycling and trash barrels. Mr. Nocella will do a full town-wide evaluation

Mr. Barile seconded the motion. Unanimous vote to approve annual appointments
Annual Appointments Town Administrator - Mr. Taylor made a motion that the Board of Selectmen vote to confirm the Town Administrator’s appointments as presented. (#2 attached) Mr. Barile seconded the motion. Unanimous vote in favor

g. Annual Fees – Mr. Taylor made a motion that the Board of Selectmen vote to approve the FY18 fees as presented. (#3 attached) Mr. Barile seconded the motion. Unanimous vote in favor.

h. Fox Hill Road – Drainage improvements. Mr. Chelgren stated drainage ditches dredged by Northeast Mosquito Control using a grant came out great. Mr. Ball will be scoping drain lines to determine if Ward Road/Foxhill lines are collapsed. Castle Road property removed a dune that protected Castle Road from storm surges. ConCom will start the compliance process.

i. Construction time constraints (daily) – By-law Amendment. Mr. Chelgren presented examples of Noise Construction Bylaws. Town doesn’t have one to limit construction hours. He

recommended putting a by-law in the next town meeting. Mr. Barile stated in the meantime treat it as a noise abatement situation and call the police.

j. Newsletter – format discussion. Mr. Chelgren presented newsletter to keep residents informed of actions from Board of Selectmen. Board will review.

k. Recognition: 1. Northeastern University – MS4 - Mr. Chelgren recognized Northeastern who is using a grant to help the town achieve their MS4 permit. He also thanked them for their \$25,000 donation to the Johnson School.

2. SWIM – Trees – Mr. Chelgren thanked Vi Patek and SWIM for donations of trees at Marjoram Park. Board echoed their thanks.

3. Oceanview Donations - Mr. Chelgren recognized Oceanview for their \$500 annual donations to “01908”, Beautification Committee, Council on Aging, and Johnson School.

l. Proclaim July 26, 2017 ADA Day – Mr. Taylor made a motion that the Board of Selectmen vote to proclaim July 26, 2017 as “ADA Day.” Mr. Barile seconded the motion. Unanimous vote in favor.


Mr. Chelgren stated as fiscal year ends revenues are high, and he commended department heads for adhering to budgets and keeping costs down.

5. **New Business** - Mr. Barile asked for a motion to form an Adhoc Technology Committee consisting of treasurer, accountant, two FinCom members, assessor, a Zobrio representative to look at improvements, integrating all departments, Modernization Act, water/sewer intake/output. Mr. Taylor made a motion that the Board of Selectmen vote to form an Adhoc Technology Committee. Mr. Barile seconded the motion. Unanimous vote in favor. Mr. Barile would like to see quarterly or monthly water bills. Mr. Taylor feels quarterly is sufficient. Mr. Ball will attend 7/19 meeting to review long and short term goals to fix sewer infrastructure.

7. **Adjourn** – Mr. Barile made a motion to adjourn to executive session the purpose of contract discussions, not to return to open session. Mr. Taylor seconded the motion. Unanimous vote to adjourn

VOTE OF THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN

I, the Clerk of the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Nahant, Massachusetts, certify that at a meeting of the board held June 21, 2017, of which meeting all members of the board were duly notified and at which a quorum was present, the following votes were unanimously passed, all of which appear upon the official record of the board in my custody:

Voted: to approve the sale of a \$1,000,000 1.55 percent General Obligation Bond Anticipation Note, Series A (the "Series A Note") of the Town dated June 30, 2017, and payable June 29, 2018, to Eastern Bank at par and accrued interest, if any, plus a premium of \$3,051.50.

Further Voted: to approve the sale of \$\$2,908,534 General Obligation Bond Anticipation Notes, Series B (the "Series B Notes" and together with the Series A Notes, the "Notes") of the Town dated July 14, 2017, and payable July 13, 2018., at par and accrued interest plus the premiums indicated as follows:

Further Voted: that in connection with the marketing and sale of the Notes, the preparation and distribution of a Notice of Sale and Preliminary Official Statement dated June 13, 2017, and a final Official Statement dated June 16, 2017, each in such form as may be approved by the Town Treasurer, be and hereby are ratified, confirmed, approved and adopted.

Further Voted: that the Town Treasurer and the Board of Selectmen be, and hereby are, authorized to execute and deliver a significant events disclosure undertaking in compliance with SEC Rule 15c2-12 in such form as may be approved by bond counsel to the Town, which undertaking shall be incorporated by reference in the Notes for the benefit of the holders of the Notes from time to time.

Further Voted: that we authorize and direct the Treasurer to establish post issuance federal tax compliance procedures in such form as the Treasurer and bond counsel deem sufficient, or if such procedures are currently in place, to review and update said procedures, in order to monitor and maintain the tax-exempt status of the Notes.

Further Voted: that each member of the Board of Selectmen, the Town Clerk and the Town Treasurer be and hereby are, authorized to take any and all such actions, and execute and deliver such certificates, receipts or other documents as may be determined

by them, or any of them, to be necessary or convenient to carry into effect the provisions of the foregoing votes.

I further certify that the votes were taken at a meeting open to the public, that no vote was taken by secret ballot, that a notice stating the place, date, time and agenda for the meeting (which agenda included the adoption of the above votes) was filed with the Town Clerk and a copy thereof posted in a manner conspicuously visible to the public at all hours in or on the municipal building that the office of the Town Clerk is located or, if applicable, in accordance with an alternative method of notice prescribed or approved by the Attorney General as set forth in 940 CMR 29.03(2)(b), at least 48 hours, not including Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays, prior to the time of the meeting and remained so posted at the time of the meeting, that no deliberations or decision in connection with the sale of the Notes were taken in executive session, all in accordance with G.L. c.30A, §§18-25, as amended.
